If you thought baby pink was just for your new Carven coat, then think again. Pink upholstery is everywhere, particularly on statement seating such as this elegant take on a wing-back chair by the Spanish design star Jaime Hayon for the Republic of Fritz Hansen. Over at Heal's, the mid-century-style floor lamp, part of the British company's first in-house lighting collection, is brought right up to date with a powder-coated pale pink finish. PURE AND SIMPLE

An antidote to chunky chairs and solid sofas, furniture with a barely there framework has an ultra-modern feel. A well-executed geometric design can add instant oomph to an interior. The easiest way is with textiles, and these colourful lampshades and cushions by Tamasyn Gambell have a distinctly retro feel. COOL CRAFTS

Contemporary craftsmanship carved its way through the festival, with manufacturers using craft techniques to create simple, sustainable pieces. Woods are waxed and designs pared down, with just a flash of colour or brass to keep things the right side of Emmerdale kitchen.
